Employment

Social work stream graduates are employed by the Department of Communities and Justice for the 18-month program in a temporary Clerk Grade 3/7 level role.

Graduates must be offered an ongoing Case Worker level role upon successful completion of the program. See the <u>Social Work stream Success Criteria</u>.

Cost to participating agencies

The home agency will fund the graduate's salary (plus on-costs) at the Clerk Grade 3/7 level and pay the cost of the education and mentoring components.

Development

Case Worker Development Training

The Social Work stream provides a pathway to becoming a Case Worker with tailored Case Worker Development Training delivered by the Department of Communities and Justice. Graduates will learn about how child protection works across systems, policies and practice, and undertake group supervision to make the best possible decisions about children and their families.

Graduate attendance and participation in all formal learning is mandatory.

Managers should check in with the graduate on a regular basis regarding progress toward their formal learning and how they can assist the graduate with their studies. The PSC will keep in contact with managers regarding the graduate's progress.

Working in Government workshop

To build foundational knowledge of government and understand how government works, graduates will attend a one-day whole of cohort workshop as part of the development program with the University of Technology. This face-to-face workshop will cover:

- Understanding NSW public sector context
- Promote the values and ethics of the NSW public service
- Teamwork and collaboration skills
- Ethical, sustainable and socially responsible practice

Graduates attend the workshop during work time and attendance and participation in all formal learning is mandatory.



Placements

Graduates will complete two x nine-month placements in different Client Service Centres.

- In placement one, graduates will build essential knowledge, values and skills for the Caseworker role. This includes 17 weeks undertaking the Caseworker Development Training, followed by experience in a Client Service Centre to apply and build on the learnings, knowledge and capability developed through the case worker training.
- In placement two, graduates will gain broader experience and exposure to the issues facing children. They will be placed in a different Client Service Centre and gain further field experience and build on their job capability.

Performance and Development Plans (PDP)

Graduates complete one PDP with each 9-month placement in consultation with their manager. A dedicated online platform has been developed to facilitate a consistent and accessible process across the sector.
